

Author guidelines

Strict compliance with these instructions will speed the editorial process; serious non-compliance will cause the return of the manuscript prior to commencing the review process. Word limits will be adhered to or the manuscript will be returned without review. All manuscripts will be subject to a minimum of two reviews.

The types of articles to be considered will be:

- Short communications (3000 words, including two figures).
- Abstracts of theses and dissertations (200-500 words).
- Other: advertisements such as workshops, conferences, courses, books, and funding agencies etc.

Instructions for short communications

Type manuscript in **English, 1.5-spaced** and include one color picture of the deer studied. Articles should be prepared in Microsoft Word, Rich Text Format (an available "save as" option on most current word processors). Do not send manuscripts in pdf. **Margins:** 2.54 cm (1 inch), top, bottom and sides.

Font: Times New Roman size: 11 points

Title: Type title in bold, **font size 14**, standard title format (e.g. **Emerging diseases in deer**). The title should be short and informative.

List authors' names and last names at a **size of 11 points**.

Affiliation: immediately below author lines

Use superscript numbers to link authors to their respective affiliations.

Specify only city and country.

Add e-mail address only for the corresponding author.

Indicate word count for manuscript

Text Body

Type the short communications text body without any indents or tabs. Do not justify paragraphs. Manuscripts should include English and Spanish versions of the abstract. The abstract should be limited to 200 words, and should state concisely the goals, methods, main results, and major conclusions of the paper. Include 3-6 keywords below the abstract.

Reference List: strings should be in chronological (oldest first) order and follow these examples:

In the body text of the manuscript use the following formats:

(White 1990)

(White & Collins 1990)

(White et al. 1990)

(White 1990, White & Collins 1990)

Avoid citing unpublished material

If it is absolutely necessary to cite, cite as

“White et al. unpub.”, and do not add to the Literature cited section. Note that reports of funding agencies as well as articles in preparation or review are unpublished material. An article can be cited when it has been officially published (either in a printed version or when a doi number has been assigned).

Nomenclature

Papers should follow the International Code of Zoological Nomenclature. For taxonomical terms authors should refer to the latest version of the IUCN Red List online.

Figures

All figures must be submitted inserted in the manuscript file after the references and also in a separate attachment in jpg format. The file should be saved with the name of the first author and, in the text body, please indicate, as Fig. 1, etc., the place you consider it should be inserted. Each manuscript can include 2 photos or figures.

Figure legends

Should be included on the last page of the manuscript after the references and should be clear and complete.

Tables must be included within the Word document inserted in the manuscript, not as separate attachments. The table legend should be above the table and be clear and complete. Tables should have the same spacing and font size as the manuscript.

The publishing committee will review the articles and send them for review to two referees that will suggest changes or corrections to the authors. Authors can suggest one reviewer from the DSG membership list.

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
